## President's Corner

***"The lake level has never been so low  
the drain must be leaking..."***

*I don't participate in Facebook chatter but I've  
been told the above was a very common theme  
posted this summer.*

I too am concerned, but let's take a step back. First of all, those of us who have been on the lake for decades ( 7 for me ) know that in the late 50's and early 60's the lake level was MUCH lower and your board was concerned then as we are today and drastic measures were contemplated including drilling 3 wells to pump water back into the lake. The next summer the level went up slightly and continued to rise.

So what about today? I have had a discussion with an engineer that knows a great deal more than I do about lake levels and conditions that cause fluctuations as well as exploring the possibility that there IS a problem with the drain.

The first step is to determine if the low level is simply due to environmental factors or something else.

To answer that question we have engaged Progressive/AE an engineering firm, to conduct a BSL Area Climatological Analysis.

I'll report the results on both Member Planet and in the Spring Edition of this newsletter. See you on the water!

### Did you know...

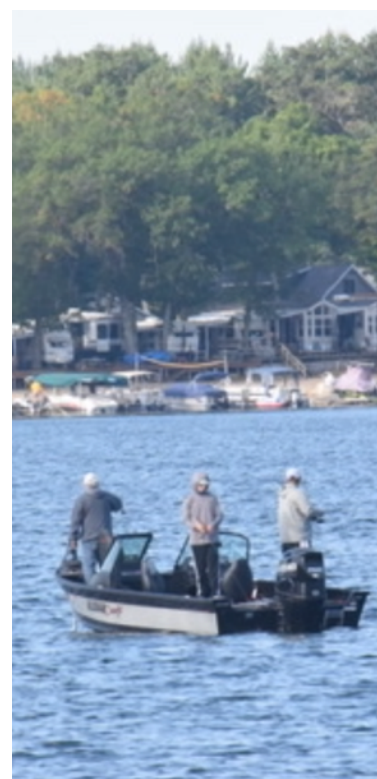
The majority of the proceeds we receive from the Poker Run betting sheets go to benefit the local community?

## *Fishing On BigStar Lake*

### **The Smallmouth Bass**

Big Star Lake is a great lake for fishing. The lake is home to a variety of game fish. The Smallmouth Bass is a great game fish because it puts up a good fight when caught. A Smallmouth Bass may leap out of the water after it is caught and even try and shake the hook out of its mouth. Very often it does! Many anglers have experienced reeling in a feisty Smallmouth Bass thinking it is tired out and then reaching over the side of the boat to pick it up, only to have it take off again and make a run for it!

The Smallmouth Bass belongs to the sunfish family and on average is about 15 inches long and weighs around 2 pounds. This fish is brownish-green and has red or orange eyes giving him the nick-name "red-eye." You can tell the difference between a Smallmouth and a Largemouth Bass by looking at their mouths. The mouth of a Smallmouth extends only to the middle of its eyes, whereas the mouth of a Largemouth goes beyond the eyes.

The diet of the Smallmouth Bass consists of crayfish, insects, and minnows. During the summer months when the weather turns hot, this fish will often feed at night or early in the morning when it is cooler. Spring is nest building time for the Smallmouth Bass. Their nest is made in shallow water when the water temperature goes above 60 degrees. The female Smallmouth will lay her eggs and then return to the deeper, cooler water while the male remains by the nest to guard the eggs from creatures that will eat them.

As you can see from our 2023 Fishing Contest results Smallmouth Bass fishing is alive and well at Big Star Lake.
